Aspire Richmond Support Society offers a continuum of care throughout the lifespan of an individual with a disability. This includes early intervention supports for infants and children, child and youth care, adult day and residential services, employment options, and more.

Infant Development & Community Outreach Consultant (1 year contract)

The Infant Development & Community Outreach Consultant assists families/caregivers to support the development of their children during early years by implementing play-based strategies in their home and connecting them to community programs and enhanced services. The consultant also establishes partnerships with community agencies to facilitate access to service, reduce barriers, and build strong relationships with families seeking support for their children. Additionally, the consultant engages with families in the community by visiting existing groups and co-facilitating parent-child programs with other community agencies.

YOUR IMPACT:

- Provide a family-centered approach to case management, including receiving and responding to referrals and managing caseloads.
- Administer developmental screening/assessment tools to help monitor the child's development.
- Work alongside family/caregiver to create developmental goals.
- Identify and develop partnerships with community organizations serving the early years population to connect people with common interests with one another.
- Facilitate workshops and group sessions to provide information and education relating to development targeting the early years.
- Providing consultation for families by bridging them to early years programs and services; and assisting with kindergarten transition when required.
- Promote a sense of belonging and inclusion for families /caregivers with children requiring extra support.

YOUR CAPABILITIES:

- University degree in area directly related to child development. Preference given to those with a Post-Secondary Diploma in Supported Child Development/ Infant Development and who have held Early Intervention Consultant Positions in the past.
- Minimum 3 years of professional experience in the field of early intervention.
- Ability to use MS Programs and Client Information System.
- Ability to collaborate with others effectively including other members of the multi-disciplinary team and community partners
- A background and understanding of working with groups of different cultures, ethnicities, genders, and socio-economic backgrounds.
- Ability to organize work and work independently.
- Demonstrated knowledge and experience in developing and delivering workshops and groups to parents and caregivers.
- Current CPR and First Aid Certification and clear Criminal Records Check.
- Valid BC Driver's License and access to a vehicle.
