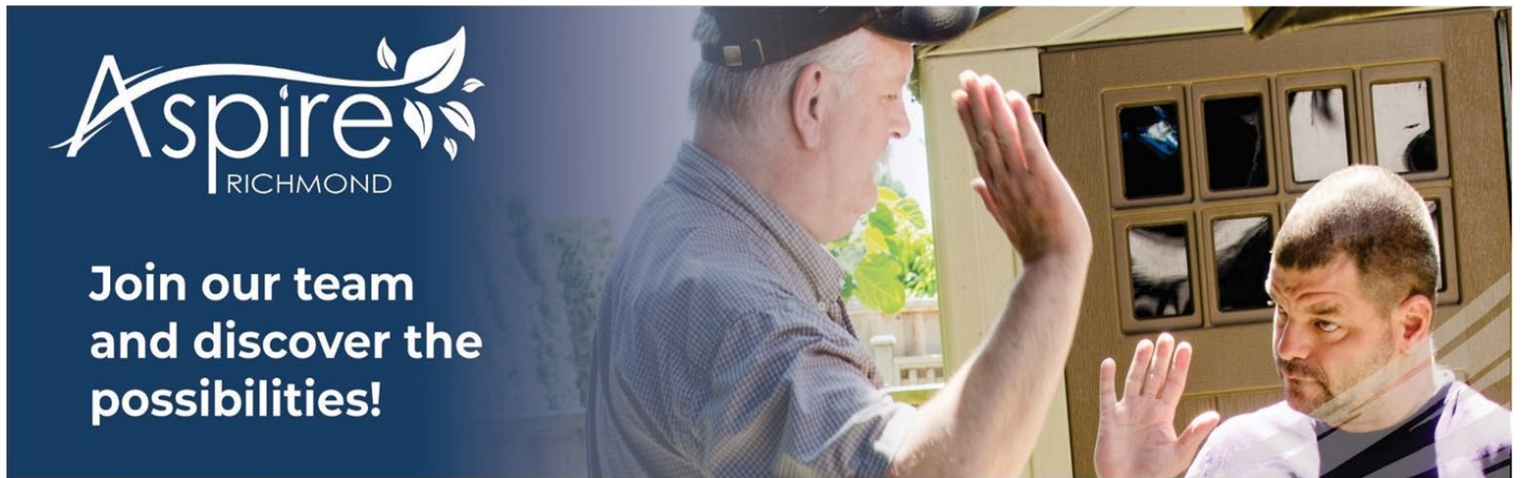

ASL Residential Support Worker (Intervenor) – Richmond, BC

Intervenors are specially trained professionals who act as the “eyes” and “ears” of the individual who is deafblind through the sense of touch. An Intervenor facilitates access to environmental information that is usually gained through vision and hearing for individuals living with deafblindness. The Intervenor will assist individuals to gather information, learn concepts and skills, develop communication and language, and establish relationships that lead to greater independence and community involvement.

Given the unique needs of individuals with deafblindness, Aspire offers training for new employees, as well as ongoing and continuous training.

YOUR IMPACT:

- Assist individuals to communicate their needs, likes and preferences;
- Empower individuals to make informed decisions and live enriched lives;
- Work as part of a team to support individuals to achieve identified goals;
- Follow activity plans, based on individual’s personal plans and provide input on progress to the team;
- Assist with the development and implementation of individual’s strategy plans; and
- Provide personal care as required.

YOUR CAPABILITIES:

- Must have a minimum of basic knowledge of ASL (American Sign Language). Intervenor training preferred.
- Post-Secondary Education in Intervenor for Deafblind Persons, Community Support Worker, Social Services Worker, ASL Training, Personal Support Worker or related field; and 6 months of related work experience is preferred.
- Good written and verbal communication skills.
- Commitment to demonstrating respect, leadership, trust and teamwork;
- Current First Aid certification.
- Clear Criminal Record Check.
